# "Road to California"


Our April journey in "Never Enough Nine Patch" conjures up images of driving chrome behemoths across country on Rt. 66 back in the 50's.

This one is a "guy's" quilt ... no frilly hearts and flowers here. Colors are black, tan and white-on-white. No nonsense! This is for the man in your life who just can't understand why you insist on cutting up a perfectly good piece of fabric, only to sew it back together again.

Road to California is simply constructed with five 4-patch blocks (black and white) and 4 half square triangles (tan and white). Sew scant 1/4" seams. Unfinished size is 12-1/2".

### Fabric:

Fabric #1: white tone-on-tone - (1) 11"  $\times$  5-1/2" rectangle, (1) 2-1/2"  $\times$  30" strip

Fabric #2: black (colored print on black is fine) - (1) 2-1/2" x 30" strip

Fabric #3: tan (colored print on tan is fine) - (1) 11" x 5-1/2" rectangle

## Assembly:

For Half Square Triangles MAKE 4:

- 1. Using a #2 pencil, draw lines on the back of the 11"  $\times$  5-1/2" piece of white fabric as shown on the right, solid lines are cut lines, dashed lines are sew lines.
- 2. Lay white and tan fabrics face to face, pin, sew on the dotted line (scant 1/4" from solid line).
- 3. Cut on the solid lines (one vertical, two diagonal).
- 4. Press to darker fabric.
- 5. Trim blocks to 4-1/2" square.





# Assembly (contd.):

### For Four Patch MAKE 5:

- 1. Sew 2-1/2" strips together, press to dark.
- 2. Cut strips into 2-1/2" pieces.
- 3. Face two 2-1/2" pieces together, oppose colors and set seams together. Sew as shown at right. The finished 4-patch should measure 4-1/2" square.





Completing t	he Block:
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Follow the layout shown here

Be sure that each corner of the block is black.



The block will look like

Block is 12-1/2" square unfinished, 12" square finished. Sew scant 1/4" seams.



And if you win the blocks for *Road to California*, that special man in your life might be blessed to find something like this to make him know how much you love him.
