

Her workshop, "Make Your Own Garden" can be for either arty quilters or traditional quilters.

Andi's quilt "Branching Out", (which features dogwood blossoms) won best art quilt at Houston in 2006 and was in the 40 art quilts in 2007 accepted into 100,000 challenge. She is teaching at Empty Spools Seminars at Asilomar in April.

She focuses on design elements mixed with appliqué for her "Make Your Own Garden Workshop." Students can either fuse or hand or machine appliqué the project, however, she doesn't spend time teaching machine appliqué. Students are encouraged to bring enough varied fabrics for their projects; fat quarters are good. Students play with paper and scissors the first hour of the workshop, and get their design put together.

### JUDY SISNEROS


Judy Sisneros will be our guest speaker for April 19th. She took her first guilt-

This may be the shortest library report I have ever written because I only introduce one book at speaker meetings and quilt-a-thons in order to save time, but just wait until my next report as I have tons of newly acquired books to tell you about.

I have a new take on the term "shopping on line" ~~ quilters checking out the Silent Auction Tables while queuing up for lunch! Those Silent Auction Tables bring in lots of money for the library, as well as treat us to treasures to take home. Just a reminder - do play fair and do not hoard or hide items that you are bidding on - the Auction Police are watching and have been reporting – and this is supposed to be fun for all.

PAULA NADELSTERN'S KALEIDOSCOPE QUILTS - AN ARTIST'S JOURNEY CONTINUES by Paula Nadelstern - Paula, who we had the pleasure of hearing at our guild last year, writes books like she makes guilts: lots of intelligent thought and beautiful details. Even though I doubt that I will ever make this type of quilt I still really loved looking at the photos of the complicated, beautiful quilts, and reading about how she goes about designing and selecting the fabrics. I especially liked this thought: "quilters with their drawers full of UFOs (jargon for unfinished objects, referring to the propensity of most quilters to have multiple projects going on at one time) will find it interesting that I work on only one guilt at a time. I credit the switch to a single kaleidoscopic quilt from start to finish as one of the major markers on my path from amateur to artist."

ROLLING ALONG - EASY QUILTS FROM 2-1/2" STRIPS - JELLY ROLL FRIENDLY by Nancy J. Martin – If you have been wondering what to do with those pre-packaged strips, this will give your some ideas, but you do not have to purchase the "jelly rolls" as Nancy tells you how you can make your own from your stash.

If you think that the only library books are in the meeting hall, ask for a tour after a meeting and explore our four cabinets that hold over 2,000 quilting books, all arranged by categories (such as Appliqué, Amish, Babies and Kids, History). We also have magazines arranged by year in notebooks, such as Quilters Newsletter (we have every issue!), Quilting Arts, American Quilter, Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting, and more.



Volunteers are always needed before and after meetings, and I cannot thank everyone enough for helping to make our guild library the best in the entire world!
