


Janice Rodgers

Raised in San Francisco, Janice has fond memories of the quilts made by her grandmother and greatgrandmother from Nebraska. If there is a genetic connection in quilter families, it was passed on to her by an older generation, because the bug skipped her mother.

Janice's inspiration now comes from the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild. She loves seeing the great variety of quilts displayed at "Show and Tell," and always enjoys learning something new from her friends or our

speakers' presentations. Melinda Bula, our speaker last quest month, advises that when you are presented with a challenging new skill, go for it ... what do you have to lose? Think outside of the box, and don't listen to the critics, especially that loud one inside your head.





taking any more classes until she finishes at least six of the projects she has back logged. Janice never does one quilt from beginning to end without having something else started. Her UFO's are numerous and reflect her preference for the fall color palette; blues, greens and golds.

Janice is grateful for the level of energy, talent and support provided at SRQG. If searching for a pattern, or needing suggestions or ideas about a certain technique, there is always someone to lend a hand or give advice. It is evident that SRQG is meeting the needs of a very unique niche in the community, as shown by the great attendance we have during the meetings. She honors all of the people willing to work on the committees and community projects.

She is pleased that she was awarded "best use of color," and has twice won "best hand guilting" from the guild. As one who prefers hand guilting to machine guilting, she is able to consistently guilt 8 to 10 stitches per inch.




Pointless Sisters Art Quilt Group Exhibit Continues at the Occidental Center for the Arts

April - Kaleidoscope

The next chapter in "Good Foundations" will teach you to piece together two sections of a paper pieced block. There are only six pieces of fabric in this block. The trick will be to sew the two sections together so that the center points match and the diagonal seam stays aligned.

Make this block with 30's, 40's or 50's small print fabric. Middle pieces are pattern on white background. Corners are pattern on medium or dark background.

That is a lot of time to finish your projects once you have entered them.

The total number of quilts per person is 6 - a combination of large and small, but not all large, please. The show should have a large variety of quilts and artists.
