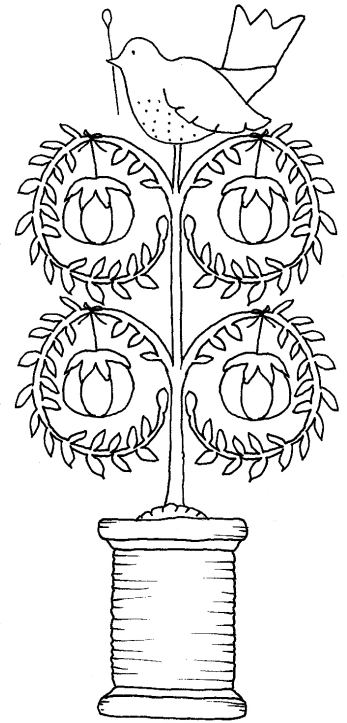
President's Message

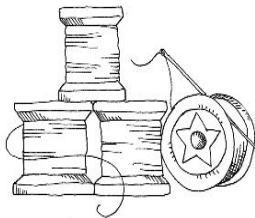

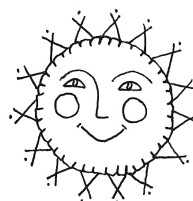

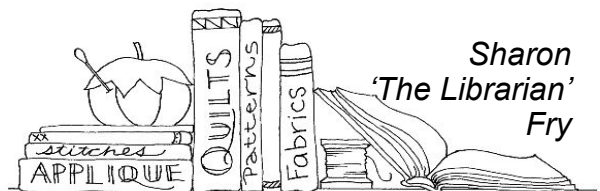

Fran Threewit

As the child's world opens up when first walking through the primary school door, it is essential to her nascent passion for education that she be taught and inspired by someone who evokes that very same passion.



Fran Threewit dedicated her life to helping budding students learn that mathematics can be fun, and that knowledge leads to embracing logic and critical thinking later on in life. Fran was very active in the "math world." Besides teaching for more than 40 years, she

served on boards of education, was principal in a national group that published a quadrennial journal concentrating on the creation of math programs worldwide, and published a book to help K-12 teachers open up new ways of teaching. Even though we'll be celebrating Fran's eighth decade this December, she never fully retired until just three years ago.

Fran had never sewn a stitch in her life until 2007. She had admired quilts, but not until she was faced with retirement did she think she'd like to try quilting. When she mentioned the idea to her daughters, they bought her a basic Sear's sewing machine. That was enough to get her hooked. Of course, the first thing about quilting that attracted her was the math and engineering; a hobby that appeals closely to her life's passion. She started checking out fabric, and became very involved with classes at the old Quilter's Cottage and Broadway Quilts in Sonoma. Fran soon discovered that her favorite fabric is the Civil War reproductions, especially in browns, tans, rust, and other earth tones. Needless to say, there

have been a couple upgrades of the sewing machine over the years.

Fran's mother was a longtime friend of Geraldine (Geri) Neidenbach, the mother of Jennifer Chia-verini, author of the Elm Creek Quilt novels. When Jennifer decided she wanted to write "Sonoma Rose," Geri put her in contact with Fran. Fran provided Jennifer with lots of local research and logistics, so much so that she is thanked in the book.

From that connection, Fran decided to take on "Sylvia's Sampler," an Elm Creek Quilt pattern of 144 blocks, as her first major project. An excellent way to learn a wide variety of quilting techniques, it took her three

years to complete. Quilted by former SRQG member Jan Head, she entered it into the Sonoma County Fair in 2011 and won an award. Pam McVey, a longtime friend, invited Fran to check out the guild and she joined right away. Grateful for meeting new people and creating new friendships, she finds constant inspiration

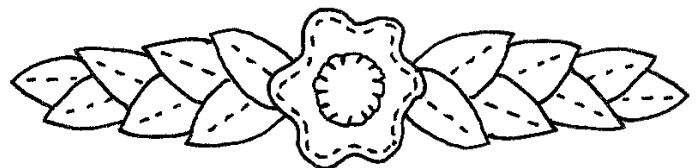
from all the creative energy; Fran especially enjoys the speaker presentations, and has participated in several workshops.

Fran enjoys many aspects of quilting but has a special liking for machine and hand applique. While she is mostly attracted to reproduction fabric, she also likes to work with batiks. Fran likes needle turn applique for on-the-go projects.

Realizing she can no longer consider herself a novice, in these few short years Fran has found her quilting muse. We are graced by her ever-present smile, her insatiable appetite for learning something new, and her willingness to share her skills with other quilters.

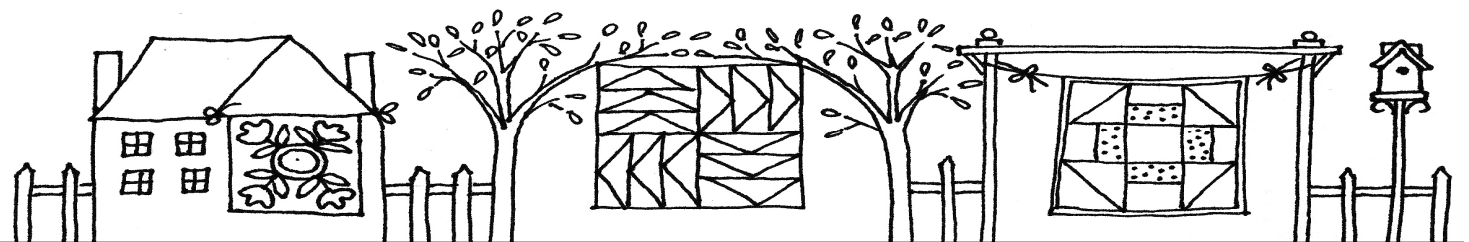
