With Quick-Strip Paper Piecing you'll be piecing blocks and quilts in a fraction of the time!

The Wishing Star is set on point with triangular block portions filling the corners *Wishing Star:* This star design looks great set straight

or on point. Block portions can also be used as setting triangles or as borders for many different design options.



Program October 18th Lyn Mann ~ Head For the Border

This is a lecture devoted to borders and all you ever wanted to know about them. Lyn will show many quilts with pieced borders and explain how she chose and constructed them. Spacer borders will be explained so you can make any border fit any quilt. Time permitting, borders can be planned for guild members quilts.

Workshop October 19th Lyn Mann ~ Throw Tradition a Curve

In this class, we will replace half-square triangles in traditional blocks with a curved two-patch to give a whole new contemporary look to old favorites. A great new design adventure with untold possibilities but easy enough for the near beginner. The "Creative Curve" ruler will be used for ease in rotary cutting.






do not like the job you are given, don't be shy – let us know what you would rather do. I can never thank everyone enough for their assistance and support with making our library the best in the entire world!

Keep it up!





Amendment to By-Laws

Amendment to SRQG Bylaws passed June 7th 2012

At the June 7th 2012 business meeting, the members of the Santa Rosa Quilt Guild approved the following amendment of the Bylaws, requesting that the term limits for elected officers be increased from 2 terms to 3 terms:

Please correct your personal copy as well as any committee copies of your by-laws in ARTICLE VI Election of Officers Section C. Tenure to read as follows:

Article VI, Section C

"Tenure No officer may be elected for more than 2 3 consecutive terms in the same office."

The following is an explanation of the by-law change.

The elected officers are: President, Vice-President, Program Chair, Program Chair-Elect, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Parliamentarian. Term limits are still a beneficial practice, as they prevent any single prevailing attitude from becoming entrenched. However, in the case of the lengthy learning curve for Treasurer, and the difficulty with filling the position, a third consecutive term would be an advantage for the Guild. The Executive Board could identify no downside to this moderate change in term limits. As with the 2-term limit, there is no obligation on the part of any elected officer to remain in position for more than a single term.




