

At other tables we will have mats and rotary cutters set up for trimming quilts before they are turned. If you'd like to sew around the edges of quilts or work on quilting, bring your machine with a walking or free-motion foot.

If you prefer to hand sew, please bring your own scissors, needles, and thimble.




Wearing your nametag is a huge help to everyone. This is an excellent way for us to get to know each other.

**Sonoma Star** is another original pattern designed for SRQG Block of the Month. We hope you have fun and enjoy the results of this striking color combination.






Everyone seemed to have a good time, there were a variety of items and I saw people with their arms full of fun for their sewing rooms. \$138.70 was donated to SRQG.




